





Sustainable Agricultural Lands Conservation Program (SALC) Draft Guidelines Now Available for Public Comment

Online Public Workshops March 3rd and March 9th

The <u>California Strategic Growth Council</u> and the <u>Department of Conservation</u> (DOC) are pleased to announce the release of the 2020/2021 <u>Sustainable Agricultural Lands</u> <u>Conservation Program (SALC) Draft Guidelines</u>. DOC is hosting a series of online workshops to share program information and to solicit public input.

About the Program: The <u>SALC</u> Program supports agricultural conservation, economic growth and sustainable development by providing grants for two types of projects:

- **Planning grants** that support the development of local and regional land use policies and economic development strategies to protect critical agricultural land
- Agricultural Conservation Acquisition grants that are used to permanently protect croplands and rangelands that are at-risk of conversion to sprawl development.

<u>Draft guidelines</u> are posted on the website and will be available for public comment through March 23, 2021.

<u>Housing and Sustainable Communities Program (AHSC)</u>. SALC complements investments made in urban areas with the purchase of agricultural conservation easements, development of agricultural land strategy plans, and other mechanisms that result in GHG reductions and a more resilient agricultural sector.

The program invests in agricultural land conservation with revenue from California Climate Investments (CCI) made available for projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions while providing additional benefits to California communities. CCI is derived from quarterly cap-and-trade auction proceeds, which are administered by the California Air Resources Board. The Department of Conservation works in cooperation with the Natural Resources Agency as SGC's implementation partner for the program.
